I was thinking a quartet, and would've been thrilled at that. So imagine how excited I was to learn they were talking about the whole, 55-member Proud Image Barbershop Chorus! And you did it! You arrived in what was surely the first fancy charter bus ever driven into Bolan. And all it cost me to get you there was a keg of beer for your bus trip home. I'll never forget the spectacular outdoor concert you performed there in Bolan – in front of 1,700 people! It proved once again that, often, the best things we do in life are the things we do for nothing – for no pay. (Or in this case, it proved once again how far 55 men will go for a keg of free beer!)

The following spring, you brought the people of Bolan – all 16 of them – to Waterloo to be special honorees at your spring show. And I know that there have been many other acts of kindness and generosity that you have performed over these four decades. You have distinguished yourselves and your organization as MVPs in music, culture and community.

God bless you all and, like you did long ago in Bolan, please sing "Amazing Grace" for me.

I'm so excited, I was able to go out on assignment! The first stop was at Deerwood Park, Evansdale, and guess who I found. David Boyd, or as we call him "Dave", the Proud Image fearless director. Generations of barbershop go before him, his grandfather Carl Boyd late 50's, his father Irv Boyd late 60's. They hail from the Mason City Chapter. Dave became a member of this chapter in 1979. He is married to Tami, and the father of Eric, grandfather to Logan and Mason. Hint! Do you see any other barbershoppers in the making?

Dave is retired following a 33-year career with Goodwill Industries, beginning as a volunteer, orchestrated some capital campaigns and completed his career as CEO of Goodwill.

Dave sings a mean lead, sang in the Favorite Sons quartet formed in 1979, won CSD in 1980 and made two trips to International. Gary Eliason, bass from Clear Lake, and a familiar name to all of us, Paul Wigley, bari who was student teaching in Mason City, and Kevin Linsicum, tenor, sang with Dave. A sidenote, there was a reunion in 2020, celebrating 40 years ago.

Dave attends PI board meetings as Director, since 1982. His memories are many and wonderful; standing out front and center, winning CSD twice, and going to International as a large chorus. PI has also won five trophies for small chorus competition. Even though the Chorus has sung for hundreds of performances, the one that really stands out for Dave is singing the National Anthem at a Walnut Ridge School basketball game; the chorus and spectators were electrified.

And another highlight, winning CSD in 1987, especially with Jim Bagby directing the Kansas City Chorus. Dave loves the fellowship of the chorus, in addition to camping, golfing, and fishing.

His favorite song "Little Pal" is a generational favorite handed down by his grandfather and dad who used to sing it to Dave.

A music degree from UNI goes with Dave, using his left hand had Piano Proficiency, played French horn, A's in conducting, and was a voice major, I would say quite a pedigree.

I'll end with this, when Jerry Easter brought Steve Klawonn to a PI rehearsal, Steve looked at Dave and said, "You were my student teacher at Evans Jr. High, in Ottumwa Iowa when I was in the 8th grade chorus." So, there you go!

It was at the anniversary show of the Proud Image Chorus, April, 2019 that this barbershopper was presented an award created just for him; Outstanding Accomplishment and Service for His Unselfish Devotion to the Ideals of Barbershop Harmony Singing, His Continuing Support of The Proud

Image Chorus and its Activities and Promotion of the Craft of Barbershop Singing. This is Denny Craun, Sr. in a nutshell, a rather large nutshell, but nonetheless, a nutshell!

From the very beginning of The Proud Image Chorus, Denny has held every position on the board, except treasurer, including president six times. He was introduced to barbershop singing in 1978 when Jerry Silver, former charter member, invited him to a guest night. He even remembers the date, June 20, 1978! Over the past 40+ years, he has sung lead, bass, and continues to sing baritone. He was presented the coveted Barbershopper of the Year award two times over his tenure with the Chorus.

He has been married to his wife, Linda, throughout his barbershop career. Linda's undying support of the Chorus has helped make it possible for Denny to enjoy this thing called barbershop! They have two grown children, son, Den Jr, who is now a member of the Chorus and sings with his dad on the risers, and daughter, Lori. They have three grandchildren. Denny worked as a horticulturist for Allen Hospital and Plant Services for UNI before retiring more than ten years ago. In addition to the countless hours Denny has devoted to the Chorus, whether he is singing, compiling a list of songs to sing at contest or on show as a part of the Music Committee or setting up risers, he enjoys golfing, bowling and is an active member of Our Savior's Lutheran Church where he grew up. Denny began singing in chorus in high school and in his church choir at Our Savior's when he was only twelve where he continues to sing today. He sang baritone with his quartet, Daze Gone Bye for more than 30 years before becoming a part of his new quartet, At Last. He is also a part of the local, vocal band, The Doo Wops.

Denny's most memorable experience was winning district competition in Kansas City in 1980. The chorus

hoped to place in the top five and winning the competition is still one of his favorite memories. Denny loves being a part of the chorus. He loved it when the crowd went wild as the vests came off during the Irish song! This was prior to his six-year induction into the Marines where he served as a cook much of the time on ship. Being a part of the Marine Corp allowed him to travel to beautiful parts of the world, such as the Mediterranean Sea and Panama.

Den has been married to his wife, Pam for nearly 25 years. They have two children, Kayla and Daniel. For the past five years, Den has been working for the United States Postal Service, which has included serving as trainer. Performance Etiquette by Music VP Dan Bogart

Gentlemen,

After getting the performance etiquette pointers last week in practice, I thought it appropriate to put them in the newsletter and add a few:

- When getting ready to sing, lean just slightly forward on the balls of your feet. When everyone does it, it's a cool visual that gives the audience a sense of anticipation.
- When singing, stand with your outside foot (if you're on the right side of the risers, that's your right foot; the left side, left) slightly ahead of your inside foot.
- Don't lock your knees; keep them slightly bent.
- If at any time you feel you need to sit because you're getting weak or light-headed, please do so. We don't want anyone to fall over.
- No matter the venue--outdoor or indoor--keeping yourself hydrated is very important. Drink plenty of water starting a few days before the performance, but especially the day before and the day of.
- When the pipe is blown, that is the signal to focus on the director.
- Don't let your eyes wander during a song—it will stand out.
- During a song, keep your eyes focused on the director, no matter where he goes.
- When a quartet is singing, be focused on them. Stand at parade rest. Feet should be shoulder-width apart and one hand is grabbing your other closed hand in front of you at your waist. And do not applaud, cheer, or whistle for the quartet. Let the audience do that.
- Be expressive when you sing, especially with your face, but use your whole body. If the song is a happy song,

make sure the audience sees you smile. If it feels like you're overdoing it, you're probably getting close to doing just enough.

· Attire for most non-show performances is red PI polos, black pants, and black socks and shoes. For UNI performances and a select few others, we wear our purple shirts instead of the red. For shows, it's our black tux, red or blue tie, and white shirt ensemble, black socks, and black shoes. Until next month, Keep On Singing!

The Proud Image Chorus's newest quartet, At Last, formed in the fall of 2019. After rehearsing a few times and considering several names (including the Four Decades, as current members are in their 40's, 50's, 60's and....older), the group settled on the name of the Mack Gordon and Harry Warren classic made famous by singer Etta James – At Last – though we joke that the real reason for the name was to make it easy for our lead to remember who we are.

Al Ferden sings lead. Al is a long-time member of the Proud Image, including the years a decade or so ago when rehearsals consisted of a handful of singers, and has sung on show quartets, but At Last is his first official quartet. Al is semi-retired, but keeps busy laying tile for friends of friends. Rehearsals typically take place in Al's basement or garage, and we're grateful for the patience of his wife Doreen and curiosity of his cat, Sam.

Singing tenor is Steve Klawonn, who also serves as President and Assistant Director of the Proud Image. Steve joined the Proud Image when he moved to the Cedar Valley to pastor the Price of Peace Lutheran Church in Evansdale, where the chorus rehearses. Steve has a rich and long barbershop history that includes directing multiples choruses. Previously, Steve sang in the Extraordinaires out of Ottumwa.

For the Chorus, Denny typically blows the pitch, organizes the music, develops the riser charts, creates song charts for shows, and regularly reminds chorus director Dave Boyd of the first word of every song. Denny sang for many years in the Daze Gone Bye quartet.

Newest to both the Proud Image and the world of barbershop is bass Jeff Morgan, who joined the PI in 2018 at the invitation of fellow bass Dan Bogart. Jeff teaches physics and science education at UNI. Although he has previously sung in church choirs, he is still busy learning what things like “the edge” and the “barbershop seventh” are.

Proud Image Director Dave Boyd has coached the quartet during several of our rehearsals, helping us work on singing approach, balance, vowel formation, breathing and many other technical elements that we hope take our foursome to a new level of singing and performance. We appreciate his ear and advice.

In the realm of odd trivia, we recently realized that Steve is 11 years older than Jeff, Al is 11 years older than Steve, and Denny....well, Denny would like everyone to know that he is NOT 11 years older than Al!

At Last has been busy building a repertoire of quartet songs that Al remembers all of the words to, and now, fully vaccinated, looks forward to upcoming opportunities to perform around our community. Chapter Updates From Around the State of Iowa:

Algona - Algona has resumed rehearsals, as virtually all are fully vaccinated. They are concentrating on three summer church sing-outs to reintroduce barbershopping back into the communities.

Des Moines - They have been meeting in-person at Grandview University since last Fall. They just completed a virtual annual show which is now being edited and should be out in late summer. They are in discussions

with the Sweet Adaline chapter about a joint Christmas show.

Cedar Rapids - They are meeting Tuesday evenings at the Scottish Rite Cathedral in person with about 20 guys attending. They are planning to create a joint chorus with Iowa City and perhaps Davenport which will compete in Lawrence under the direction of Chad Knipfer. Most of their singers have been vaccinated and their plan is to continue meeting in person. They are working with the Old Capitol Chorus to do some inner chapter activities. They will perform in person for the Tribute to Heroes in June.

Sioux City - Paul Roberts reported that they started rehearsals in February with 15 singers but are still maintaining social distancing and wearing masks. They are scheduled to sing the National Anthem at six ballgames this summer, will perform at three area churches and two arena football games. Next week they will be performing for Barbergehtti, a spaghetti dinner fundraiser. They are not planning to attend contest in Lawrence KS in October.

Denison - Bob Brockhoff said it has been a year since the Denison chorus has been together. Up until that time, we had been operating as a mixed chorus with eight Society members and five women singing with us. It was the hope that operating as a mixed chorus would help us grow. There had also been discussion of giving up our chapter charter if there was no growth.

They are going to have a meeting and will invite all past members to get together and discuss rejoining the chapter. SUX and DSM chapters offered to help with the event if possible.
