SWEET MEMORIES FROM APRIL 26, 1980 BY LINDA CRAUN...

FIRST CONTEST FOR BLACK HAWK METRO, Central States District Convention, Kansas City, Missouri Several wives had taken the city bus to Crowne Center in Kansas City Saturday morning, the same day as chorus competition which didn't start until 1:30 p.m. Debbie Andersen (Kevin Andersen's wife at the time) and I caught the bus to go back downtown, so we could get ready for the competition. The bus headed out away from downtown, but we just figured it looped around like it does in Waterloo. We were on it for quite some time when the bus driver parked and got off the bus. When we questioned him, he said this was the end of the line; we asked how we could get back downtown. He told us where we could catch another bus. At the first bus pickup we stopped at, there was a very disheveled man asleep with a brown paper bag on the bus bench. We decided to walk further down the street. We talked about calling a taxi, but the buildings were dark with bars on the windows (this was before cell phones). Finally, a bus came along and we got on. We asked; it would end up back downtown.

We're at 79th Street and we only have half an hour to get downtown. Does this bus pick someone up at every corner? It sure seemed like it stopped at every single corner and the bus wouldn't move until the person found a seat. By the time we got downtown, we were already late for the chorus competition. We had to go back to our hotel rooms because we didn't have our badges to get into the competition, so we went ahead and changed into our red, black and white. On the elevator going down, I started laughing; Debbie looked at me horrified and asked how I could laugh. I told her if I didn't laugh, I was going to sob. Anyway, we made it to the contest, but we missed the Proud Image performance.


However, we were there for the celebration! Back then, they announced the top 5 choruses, in no particular order, and then they announced No. 5 through No. 1. You had to be one of the top 5 choruses to compete in the Fall; that was the chorus goal. Proud Image went crazy (screaming, whooping, clapping) when they were named in the top 5. Then the emcee asked that Proud Image settle down so he could announce the order of the 5 choruses: No. 5, Spirit of St. Louis; No. 4, Sioux Emperians; No. 3, Air Capitol; No. 2, Daniel Boone; NO. 1, BLACK HAWK METRO!!! Pure pandemonium—jumping up and down, hugs, jumping over seats!!

If you are the No. 1 chorus, you perform in the Saturday evening show, so we did get to see their performance.

(An aside, Kevin Andersen still has the pocket knife that Debbie bought for him on that shopping trip.)
