So here we are again - joint Christmas shows! What started out slowly is gaining momentum as guys are doing a great job getting off their music. Thanks to the Proud Image guys for your dedication in attending rehearsals, both at Waterloo and Mason City! Let's make December 4 another memorable day for our audiences (and ourselves). It's a joy singing with you fellows.

Benefit Concert for House of Hope

One hundred percent of the proceeds from “A Barbershop Christmas” will be donated to House of Hope. The House of Hope had its origin 25 years ago when community church leaders formed Christian Community Development (CCD). They were aware of the growing problem of homelessness among single mothers in the Cedar Valley and created a support system.

The mission of House of Hope is to provide single mother families and women who age out of foster care with individualized support, transitional housing, independence, and permanent homes.

Their vision is to end the cycle of homelessness in the Cedar Valley with respect, empowerment, stewardship and accountability.

The goal of the House of Hope is to empower women, build their future and enrich communities. House of Hope provides a home, a community and a transformation for single mother families in homelessness and women 18-24 who age out of foster care.

The House of Hope helps empower single mothers to give them and their children a chance at self-sufficiency to break the cycle of poverty and homelessness. Every woman is expected to obtain a degree or employment to work towards independence. Because these women are capable, expectations are high. The House of Hope is proud to share that it is possible to go from Homeless to Homeowner in the span of two years, as demonstrated by some of the women.

Through House of Hope, the women are provided child care and transportation, receive employment readiness programs, health, wellness and finance programs, all which help build self confidence and self-esteem. The success rate is 92%. This program is 100 % community funded.
